Synopsis

"The Music Man" is a beloved American musical that takes audiences on a heartwarming journey to the small town of River City, Iowa, in the early 20th century. With infectious music and unforgettable characters, this classic tale explores themes of change, love, and the power of music to bring a community together.

The story begins as a charismatic and charming con artist, Professor Harold Hill, arrives in River City with a devious plan to swindle the townspeople by convincing them that their youth are in moral danger and can be saved through the establishment of a boys' band. He sells musical instruments and uniforms to the parents, promising to teach their children how to play, despite the fact that he knows nothing about music.

In River City, Hill meets Marian Paroo, the town's skeptical librarian and piano teacher. Marian, initially suspicious of Hill's intentions, becomes a central figure in the story as she discovers the truth about him. Despite her reservations, Marian finds herself falling in love with Hill, which adds complexity to her efforts to reveal his true nature.

As the story unfolds, the townspeople, including the Mayor and his wife, form a barbershop quartet, young lovers emerge, and the community begins to come together through their involvement in the band. Hill's plan appears to be working until the truth begins to unravel. Marian's younger brother, Winthrop, who had been struggling to speak due to a lisp, finds his voice through music, and the town starts to change in positive ways.

"The Music Man" ultimately showcases the transformative power of music, the importance of honesty and community, and the redemptive potential of love. It is a joyful and heartwarming tale filled with memorable songs like "76 Trombones," "Till There Was You," and "Ya Got Trouble."

In the end, "The Music Man" reminds us that even the most unlikely heroes can inspire positive change and that love has the ability to heal and bring people together, creating harmony in both music and life.

Adult Audition Information

Auditions for adult roles are open to people aged 16+ at the time of auditions.

Adult vocal auditions are by appointment only and will be approximately 5 minutes in duration. Vocal Auditions will be located at 22 Princes Highway, Norlane and can be booked at www.centrestage.org.au/musicman

Please prepare one (1) audition song of up to one minute duration. Please choose a classic or golden age song in the style of Music Man that is not from the show.

Auditions are to be performed to a backing track. Auditionees are required to bring their backing track on a device with a 3.5mm head phone jack output. No sheet music required. Please choose a song that best demonstrates your vocal range and your performance ability. A separate vocal range test <u>may</u> also be requested.

There will be a space to warm up prior. Auditionees may not enter as a duo and must complete the audition as a solo. Please note, we may be running behind by 10 mins on some evenings.

Our team has a vision for "The Music Man" that emphasises the art of storytelling through dance and stylised movement. We will explore various physical language styles to breathe new life into this production. Your technical abilities will be essential in realising this vision.

This production features both intense dance numbers that demand precision and dedication, as well as moments where character and narrative must shine through beautiful physical language. We seek performers who can seamlessly blend both elements, creating breathtaking artistry. When executing choreography, think like an actor, as the intention behind your movements is paramount.

All cast members must participate in the dance auditions for consideration. The production team may invite some participants to stay for additional sessions, as we have diverse roles to fill, each requiring unique skills.

Please wear clothing that allows freedom of movement, and if you are scheduled for the 2nd or 3rd session, fitted attire is preferred to showcase your lines. Don't forget to bring runners and jazz shoes if available. For female-identifying performers or those who prefer them, chorus heels are encouraged.

Be advised that the session times listed above may be subject to change throughout the day. Your commitment to this audition is greatly appreciated. We look forward to seeing your talent and dedication on display at the Adult Dance Audition for "The Music Man."

We will be casting a "Dance Ensemble" and "Character Ensemble" respectively.

Youth Auditions

We're inviting youth performers to audition for The Music Man. We're looking for approximately 24 youth characters for the production. Youth auditionees will be require to attend the relevant audition below:

- No Pre-Learning Required You don't need to prepare anything in advance for the audition. Just bring your enthusiasm, energy, and passion for performing!
- Knowledge of "76 Trombones" is a Plus While it's not mandatory, having some familiarity with the iconic song "76 Trombones" will be advantageous. If you're already a fan of the music, this is your chance to shine!
- Dance and Choreography Audition Get ready to show off your dance moves!
 During the audition, we'll have a dedicated dance and choreography segment. Wear comfortable clothing that allows you to move freely, and don't forget your sneakers or dance shoes to strut your stuff!
- Arrival Time: 9:30 AM To ensure a smooth audition process, please arrive close to 9:30 AM. Our friendly team will be there to welcome you, sign you in, take photos, and provide you with labels. This way, we can keep everything organised and ensure you have the best audition experience possible

We ask parents to remain at the venue for this period, as your child will not be required for the full duration. However, parents will not be permitted in the audition space. We encourage your child to familiarise themselves with song from the show ,which will be explored in the audition.

*CentreStage also has the opportunity to provide 1:1 private vocal lessons for cast members to work on solo's or harmonies within our education program. Those opportunities will be discussed directly with the relevant individuals.

Rehearsals will take place at 26 Rodney Rd, North Geelong and 22 Princes Highway, Norlane during peak rehearsals.

Our strongest advice is to block out the Monday, Wednesday and Sunday rehearsal times throughout the rehearsal period as best you can and assume you will be required most rehearsals. A full rehearsal schedule will be provided at time of casting for the entire run.

Accommodations will be made to those who record known absences on their audition forms. In fairness to everyone, it is expected that you will be available for scheduled rehearsals. Melbourne-based performers are invited to audition and consideration will be made to the travel commitments you may experience in scheduling.

Marian Paroo

(She/Her, Age 35 - 45, Vocal Range: G3 - A5)

River City librarian and music teacher; lives with her widowed mother and younger brother. Has become guarded and defensive as a result of being at the epicenter of town gossip; has been hyper-focused on raising her younger brother, and fears her chance for romance may have passed her by. Utterly un-charmed by Harold.

Initial Audition:

We encourage you to select a classical musical theatre piece that demonstrates your ability to tell a story. We encourage booking auditions on the first nights of adults auditions.

Harold Hill

(He/Him, Age 35-45, Vocal Range: Ab2 - F4)

A traveling con-man; hops around the country "selling" band uniforms and instruments to a town, skims most of the money off the top, and hops onto the next. Charming, charismatic, fast-talker - incredibly suave, has a "song and dance man" energy - walks the walk, so to speak. Is getting a bit too old to be a con-man; guarded and defensive as a result of never allowing himself to become close to anyone. Marian is the first person he's discovered that is immune to his charm.

Initial Audition:

We encourage you to select a classical musical theatre piece that demonstrates your ability to tell a story. We recommend ballads and songs that show tempo/rhythm. We encourage booking auditions on the first nights of adults auditions.

Marcellus Washburn

(He/Him, Age 40 - 45, Vocal Range: G2 - A4)

Former con-man; used to run grifts with Harold Hill. Decided the high-risk lifestyle was no longer worth it, and settled down in River City with a nice, comfortable girl. Still has a mischievous streak and a love of the game.

Initial Audition:

We encourage you to select a comedy musical theatre piece that demonstrates your ability to set up a punch line. We recommend shows like "Funny Thing Happened on the way to the forum".

Mrs. Paroo

(She/Her, Age 55 - 65, Vocal Range: Ab3 - Eb5)

Mother to Marian and Winthrop; Irish immigrant who has carved out a life for herself in River City. Widowed, sassy, and wants love for the people she loves.

Initial Audition:

We encourage you to select a traditional musical theatre piece that demonstrates your ability to show passion and love. Think 'As long he needs me' from Oliver

Winthrop Paroo - (Youth Role) - Attend the Junior Youth Audition Process

(He/Him, Age 7 - 10, Vocal Range: C4 - Eb5)

Marian's younger brother; incredibly shy because of his lisp. Becomes a whole new person when Harold shows him acceptance and care.

Youth Audition Tip:

Practice a lisp or audible speech impediment (but we still want to hear the words). Song and Movement will be taught on day.

Mayor Shinn

(He/Him, Age 45 - 55)

Blustery, pompous, not terribly intelligent. Big fish in a small pond; inactively misogynist in his desire to be viewed as formidable, and overprotective of his business, daughters, and town.

Eulalie Shinn

(She/Her, Age 45 - 55, Vocal Range: D4 - D5)

The Mayor's wife and the engine of town gossip. Proud, a 1912 mean girl; dictates the social hierarchy of the women in town. Tolerates and manages her handful of a husband with varying degrees of patience and success.

(She/Her, Age 14 - 18, (Attend the Teen Youth Audition)

The Mayor's oldest daughter; is aware she should present a shiny and clean public image for her father's sake, but can't help having feelings for Tommy, the town rebel.

Gracie Shinn

(She/Her, Age 10 - 14)

The Mayor's youngest daughter; a bit of a tattletale and a stickler for the rules.

The town troublemaker, who happens to have a big crush on the Mayor's daughter; Harold finds a way to channel Tommy's energy into productivity.

A traveling anvil salesman - sees himself as an honest and hardworking man, and despises Harold Hill for the reputation he is giving to the rest of traveling salesmen. Comes to River City to get Harold arrested and driven out of town. Lecherous and inappropriate with women.

Piano student of Marian's; has a crush on Winthrop, but doesn't know how to express it.

A citizen and businessman of River City and member of the quartet formed by Harold Hill. Married to Mrs. Squires.

Oliver Hix - QUARTET

(He/Him, Vocal Range: F2 - C4)

A citizen and businessman of River City and member of the quartet formed by Harold Hill. Married to Alma Hix.

Ewart Dunlop - QUARTET

(He/Him, Vocal Range: F3 - F5)

A citizen and businessman of River City and member of the quartet formed by Harold Hill. Married to Maud Dunlop

Alma Hix - PICK A LITTLE

(She/Her) - one of Eulalie's gossiping friends, married to Oliver Hix

Mrs. Squires - PICK A LITTLE

(She/Her) - one of Eulalie's gossiping friends, married to Jacey Squires

Ethel Tofelmier - PICK A LITTLE

(She/Her) - one of Eulalie's gossiping friends, in a relationship with Marcellus Washburn

Maud Dunlop - PICK A LITTLE

(She/Her) - one of Eulalie's gossiping friends, married to Ewart Dunlop

The creative team are looking at casting two key parts of the Adult Ensemble. They Are:

Dance Intensive Ensemble:

- We are looking for performers who understand how to make stylistic choices with exceptional stage presence.
- Performers who have excellent technical ability.
- Performers who are strong in 2 or more of the following styles: Broadway Musical Theatre,
 Characterised Theatrical Jazz, Contemporary, Fosse, Ballet.
- Attend the Performance and Movement Based Call for The Music Man and be prepared to participate in session 2 and 3 if invited.
- Vocal Audition: All candidates for the Dance Intensive Ensemble will be required to complete a private vocal audition. Prepare a one-minute musical theatre song that showcases your vocal range.

Character Ensemble:

- We are seeking performers with strong acting abilities, distinctive character choices, and the versatility to bring a variety of roles to life.
- Attend the Performance and Movement Based Call for The Music Man. A number of tracks in the Character Ensemble may be required to do movement and stylised character moments in the production. We are looking for performers who understand how to make stylistic choices with exceptional stage presence.
- Vocal Audition: All candidates for the Character Ensemble will be required to complete a private vocal audition. Prepare a one-minute musical theatre song that showcases your vocal range.

Youth Ensemble

Various "kid" and family roles will be included. Please note children under 14 will be dual cast (i.e., two youth casts) due to Child Safe legislation and safe working practices, but will be required to attend late evenings.



Cast Fees

To ensure the success of our shows and provide you with a fantastic experience, we have outlined our membership fees and volunteer commitments below:

Membership Fee:

- Upon successfully securing a role in our production, each cast member will be required to pay a membership fee of \$125 per person. This fee includes several benefits:
- Insurance Coverage: You will be covered by our insurance during rehearsals and performances.
- Cast T-Shirt: You will receive a commemorative cast T-shirt to proudly represent CentreStage.
- Afterparty Supplies: We will organise a post-show celebration, and your membership fee contributes to the supplies and festivities.

Volunteer Commitment:

- As part of our commitment to building a strong community, each cast member is expected to nominate a person aged 18 or older to support various activities, including Bump In, Bump Out, and other volunteer tasks. This commitment entails dedicating 10 hours of volunteer work throughout the production process.

Option 1 - Waive Volunteer Commitment:

- If you wish to be exempt from the 10-hour volunteer commitment, you may choose to pay an additional fee \$100. By doing so, you remove this obligation and solely focus on your performance.

Option 2 - Waive All Fees and pay nothing

- Alternatively, we offer a second option to waive all membership fees listed above. However, there is a catch. To qualify for this option, you must be willing to contribute 15 additional hours of volunteer work to CentreStage. Once you complete these hours, you will not be required to pay any membership fees.

We believe that both options offer flexibility to our cast members, allowing you to tailor your involvement to your preferences and schedule. We highly encourage active participation in our vibrant community, but we understand that personal circumstances may vary.
